<u>Overview</u>	
<p>Pupil Premium funding was introduced in 2011. As Government state, <i>‘the pupil premium is additional funding given to schools so that they can support their disadvantaged pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers.’</i> Schools are also in receipt of this funding for any pupil whose parent/s are part of the regular Armed Forces. Pupils who have been eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years will continue to receive the funding. Guidance has been provided by the Government to help allow schools to make decisions on how best this funding can be spent on their pupils. It is us, as a school, who are accountable for ensuring the funding is spent in the right way; making a difference to the progress, attainment and well-being of the pupils who are in receipt of this support.</p>

Area of Spend	Cost	Desired Outcome
Referrals to Bolton Behaviour Support Service	£7000	Pupils to be able to self-regulate their behaviour and better understand the emotions of themselves and others. Provide staff with excellent strategies to support pupils with emotional needs access the mainstream curriculum.
Education Welfare Social Worker	£300	Support for families to improve attendance and punctuality. Monitoring of attendance and punctuality under 90% and putting in strategies to improve.
Year One and Two phonics intervention	£1365	To accelerate children's progress in phonics where low attainment is a barrier. To plan bespoke phonics sessions for individual pupils. To increase the percentage of children passing their Year 1 phonics screening test or to ensure that there is very good progress in phonic knowledge throughout KS1.
Additional TA support within classes during Maths and English	£19500	To identify gaps in knowledge and support children catching up to their targets.
