

## Sports Premium Report – March 2019

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport on offer.

The premium has two main aims:

- to develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- to build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- ***the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school***
- ***the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement***
- ***increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport***
- ***broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils***
- ***increased participation in competitive sport***

In 2018/2019, we have £17,860 allocated.

In addition, Strikerz are delivering a variety of sports across the key stage, assisting in covering the breadth of the curriculum. This has included teaching across all year groups, including reception class. Coaches are now delivering multi skills and tag rugby during lessons time.</p> <p><i>Strikerz run extra-curricular clubs before and after school. This has resulted in more children representing the school football team across Years 4, 5 and 6. Our Year 5/6 football team placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the town tournament. We were able to enter 2 teams into this tournament, due to the depth of participants available.</i></p>

Dance Teacher - £950 (October 18 – March 19)	<b><i>increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport</i></b>  <b><i>broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils</i></b>	Teachers present to gain knowledge of dance curriculum. Schemes of work shared from coaching company, resulting in longer term planning and delivery of dance at Egerton. Dance coverage has taken place across years 1 – 6. This has given teachers a dance scheme to teach annually to their classes.  Children representing clubs in different forms of dance out of school.
Swimming - £850 committed (Jan 19 – March 19)	<b><i>broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils</i></b>	<i>Specialist coaches teach swimming lessons at Turton High School. This also incorporates level 1 life saving. Teachers noted an increase in the confidence and skills of many of the children taking part. Data to be obtained from the swimming teachers when the lessons conclude at the end of March 2019.</i>
